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All 17 Eligible¹ Alliance High Schools Recognized as 2020 Best Public High Schools in the Nation by U.S. News & World Report

Alliance College-Ready Public Schools—the largest nonprofit network of public charter schools in Los Angeles—celebrates all 17 eligible high schools ranked in top 25% nationally in the *U.S. News & World Report* for Best Public High Schools, proving all children can learn, regardless of ZIP code or background.

Los Angeles, CA, April 21, 2020—17 Alliance high schools have been recognized as one of the 2020 Best U.S. High Schools. Alliance Ted K. Tajima High School and Alliance Marc and Eva Stern Math and Science High School have been ranked in the top 500 schools in the nation and top 50 schools in California. New to the list are Alice M. Baxter College-Ready High School and Alliance Margaret M. Bloomfield High School. All eligible Alliance high schools were ranked in the top 25% of schools in the nation.

The [*U.S. News & World Report*](#) reviews annual data on public high schools in each of the 50 states and the District of Columbia. This year, more than 24,000 schools were reviewed and ranked by their college readiness, math and reading proficiency, math and reading performance, underserved student performance, college curriculum breadth, and graduation rate.

Alliance scholars graduate high school and are admitted to college at a rate of 95 percent—higher than the local, state, and national average. Alliance credits five core values to its successful approach to learning:

1. High Expectations for All Scholars
2. Small, Personalized Learning Environments
3. Increased Instructional Time
4. Highly Qualified Educators
5. Parents as Partners

Though 93% of our incoming 6th graders enter Alliance reading below grade level, they outperform California state and local districts on state standardized testing. Ninety-five percent of Alliance scholars have graduated from high school and been accepted to college, 73% to a four-year university. Our schools have been recognized among the best in the state and nation by the U.S. Department of Education, the California Department of Education, U.S. News & World Report, and the University of Southern California (USC) Rossier School of Education.

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
